In 2019, CASI's service to our community continued to grow as we added the Dolly Parton's Imagination Library to our programs. The books are hand selected by a committee of early childhood experts to be age appropriate and to align with the child's developmental needs.

2020 will be landmark year for CASI as it purchases the closing Spring Hill Elementary in Jeffersonville for its new home. This move will save CASI thousands of dollars per year and provide a more modern facility that is more strategically located in the community which we serve.

Community Action of Southern Indiana will continue to involve the entire community in assessing local needs and attacking the causes and conditions of poverty so that together we can overcome them. Our community partners are critical to our Mission's success. By working together, we can help individuals and families acquire useful skills and knowledge and gain access to new opportunities in order to achieve self-sufficiency.

PROGRAMS

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHT- Lowering Utility Bills



Julia High-Robinson was the face of CASI for years as she worked at the front desk directing customers to resources to meet their needs. Although no longer directly employed with CASI, Ms. Julia continues to work with us to serve our community. It is fitting, therefore, that when

Ms. Julia was hit with several very large heating bills, CASI was able to help with several of its programs.

First, the Energy Assistance Program (EAP) was immediately able to help with payment towards her gas bill. Additionally, because the spike in her gas bill was due in part by a failing twenty-year-old furnace that wouldn't shutoff properly, a new program managed by EAP, the Emergency Repair and Replace (ERR) program, was able to evaluate her furnace and replace it with a new, safer, and more energy-efficient model.

With the furnace taken care of, anwas able to evaluate the rest of Ms. Julia's home and install other energy saving measures. Expertly targeted air sealing cut the air leakage in the home

almost in half, and bags of insulation blown into the attic significantly reduced the amount of heat loss through the ceiling, particularly in a large area that preveiously had no insulation at all.

Finally, with the home now much more airtight, the existing water heater would not operate without the possibility of dangerously backdrafting carbon monoxide into the home. Consequently, the water heater was replaced with a safer and more energy -efficient tankless water heater.

Ms. Julia is excited about the work that has been performed on her other CASI program, Weatherization, home. The home is now a more comfortable, more energy-efficient, and safer place to live.

ENERGY ASSISTANCE (EAP)

The Low-Income home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) assists low-income families with the high cost of home energy to maintain utility services during the winter and summer seasons.

LIFE LITERACY

A youth program designed to follow a select group of students from 8th to 12th grade. Youth are monitored in areas of leadership, character education, 40 developmental assets, critical thinking, and college readiness. A Strengthening Families approach and Family Development tools are used to include the entire family.

WEATHERIZATION

This program permanently lowers utility bills by providing energy saving home improvements to such as air sealing, insulation, and furnace tuneups.

HEAD START/ EARLY HEAD START

CASI's Head Start and Early Head Start provides programming services to over 300 children (birth - 5). Families and children receive education, case management and health/nutrition services from our Education and Family services Department.

FAMILY DEVELOPMENT

The Crisis Assistance Program is designed to help persons experiencing a financial shortfall caused by external factors. A qualified Indiana Family Development Specialist assists with the case management.

HOUSING CHOICE VOUCHER (SECTION 8)

CASI's Housing Choice Voucher Program is committed to the idea that every family has the right to safe, decent and affordable housing. Lowincome families select housing based on individual needs and are provided housing vouchers that allow them to utilize housing from approved landlords.

DOLLY PARTON'S IMAGINATION LIBRARY

A book gifting program that mails free, high-quality books to children from birth until they begin school, no matter their family's income. The books are hand selected by a committee of early childhood experts.

MINORITY HEALTH INITIATIVE

The mission of this program is to eliminate health disparities through research, training, education, advocacy, and access to health care services for minority populations with a focus on obesity, diabetes and cancer.

VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE (VITA)

VITA provides free tax preparation assistance for persons making \$58,000 or less in annual income. Our volunteers are trained and certified by the Internal Revenue Service.

HEALTHCARE NAVIGATION/

This program provides outreach, education, and enrollment for persons needing quality health plans (QHP) or additional funds to pay for healthcare costs as required under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).


INDIVIDUAL DEVELOPMENT ACCOUNTS (IDA)


The IDA program helps qualified individuals in saving for education, housing, or to start a business. IDA accounts are matched three-to-one by the State of Indiana through local lending institutions.

MICROENTERPRISE

The Microenterprise Program assists low-income, under-employed, and unemployed persons to establish their own business. The program offers business development planning, training, counseling, and technical assistance so they may gain the opportunity to participate in the economic mainstream.
